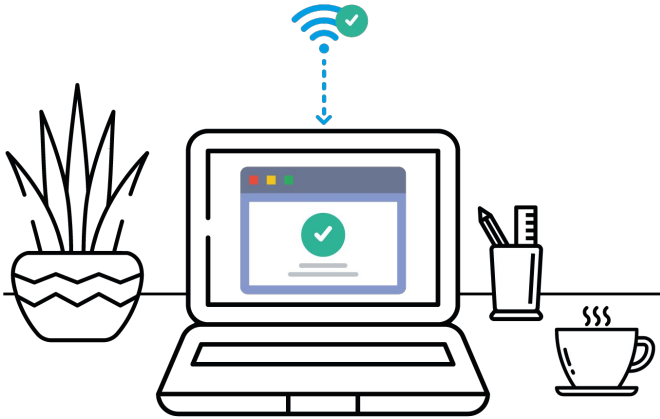


What is Kiwix?

Kiwix is an open-source software that brings internet content to millions around the world who don't have access to the internet.



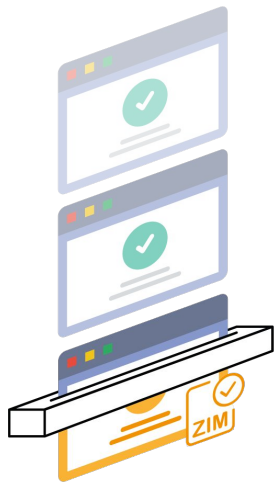
Access web content normally
with an internet connection



Access the **same** content
without an internet connection

How does it work?

Kiwix behaves like a normal browser. Instead of going online to fetch data, it reads copies of websites.



Kiwix **scrapers** copy website content and compress it into **zim** files

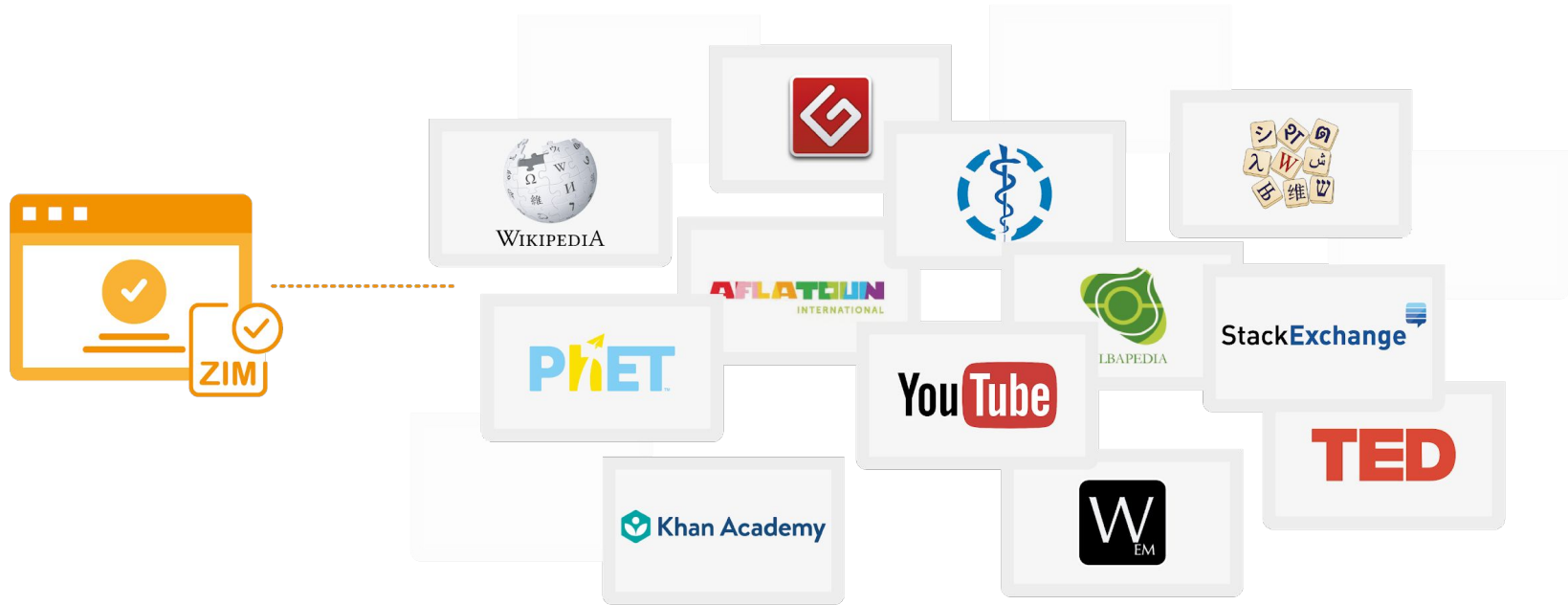
zim files can store
text, images and videos



Kiwix runs on **computers, phones, tablets and hotspots**

Thousands of websites available

Kiwix focuses on knowledge and educational websites that under a free license. There are currently almost 5,000 zim files available in 100+ languages.



Always fresh

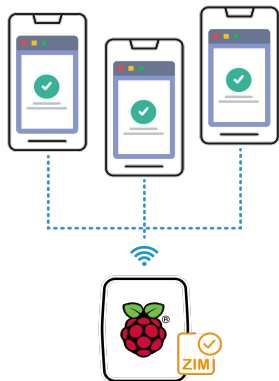
Kiwix servers regularly update zim files so that users can always access a recent copy.

with websites' latest content

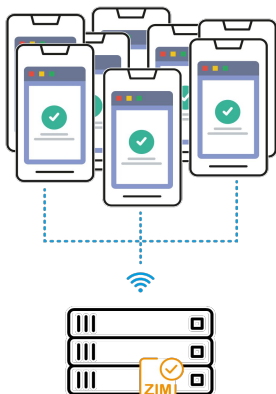
There's a Kiwix for everyone

Kiwix runs on almost every device with a screen that you can think of.



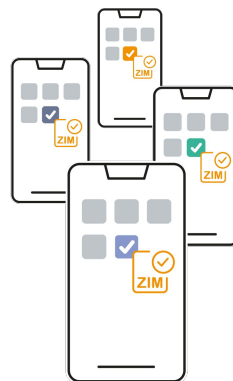
Raspberry Pi hotspots

Ideal for classrooms or small groups, the Kiwix hotspot creates a local wifi network that people can connect to from any wifi-enabled device.



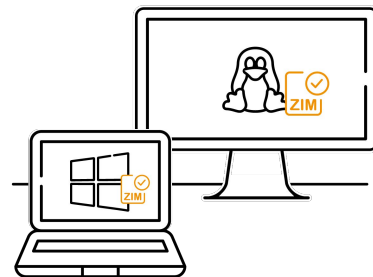
Kiwix-serve

A simple installation on a central server distributes content across a local network, providing content to the largest groups of users, e.g. at a University.



Custom applications

We can bundle an existing zim file onto the Kiwix app and rebrand it. Enables personalised partner distribution.



Kiwix-Desktop

Fits on a flash drive, runs on Windows, Mac and Linux computers. Plug-and-play and effectively cost-free to set up.

Who uses Kiwix?



We estimate the Kiwix user base to be between 3-4 million people worldwide, across all platforms. This number doubles every year or so.
